		Sarah Robinson, BSc, DVM, PhD Student, Ontario Veterinary College, University of Guelph Sarah will be discussing her research project investigating rat-associated zoonoses in urban rats from Ontario cities. Rats live in close association with humans around the world and are known to carry a number of pathogens that can be transmitted between animals and humans (zoonoses). The importance of rat-associated zoonoses is expected to increase with urbanization as more people come into contact with urban rats. There is limited research on the influence of weather and environmental factors on zoonotic pathogen carriage by rats and little is known about the prevalence of these pathogens in Ontario. The results of this study will provide crucial information on the distribution and risk factors associated with zoonotic infections in urban rats in Ontario.
